New Fundamental Sports Program Launch



Sport Hawkes Bay initiated the PALs (Physical Activity Leaders) program recently, in Primary Schools in our wider area.



There are three main things we are focusing on this term:

Number - place value, reading and writing numbers, learning basic facts.

Statistics - collecting, using and understanding data. Geometry - shapes and their properties.

We use "Tiniroto Sprints" to challenge ourselves to learn our addition and subtraction basic facts.

The children have up to 2 minutes to answer 20 basic fact questions which are done in levels. If they get 20/20 twice, they can move up to the next level. The children mark and record their own results. It is up to them to be honest, challenge themselves and try to do better each day. If they get a better time or a better score than the previous day, their name goes in the treasure box to celebrate

Every Monday in their homework books, a Whanau of facts will come home for them to learn. This is one of the facts they didn't know, or had to work out, in their Tiniroto sprints.
