From the Principals Desk



Kia Ora Koutou Parents and Whānau, My newsletter write up this week shares the future of mathematics and statistics learning at Frasertown School.

We are implementing the new New Zealand Curriculum for Mathematics and Statistics, Te Mātaiaho, which is designed to empower our students to become confident and capable mathematicians and statisticians.


This new curriculum has a clear purpose: to help students study, learn, and appreciate the power and beauty of abstraction, reasoning, and symbolic representation. It aims to equip them to investigate, interpret, and explain patterns and relationships in quantity, space, time, data, and uncertainty. Mastering maths means our students are able to accurately and efficiently use mathematics and statistics as a foundation for new learning, problem-solving, reasoning, and making connections between concepts.

The curriculum is structured around three key elements: Understand, Know, and Do.

- Understand focuses on the deep and enduring big ideas and themes that students develop over their learning journey. This helps connect school maths with the wider world and identifies critical learning.
- Know comprises the meaningful and important content, concepts, and topics that exemplify and enrich students' understanding of the big ideas. These are broken down into six strands: number, algebra, measurement, geometry, statistics, and probability
- Do describes the practices (skills, strategies, processes, and competencies) that are particular to mathematics and statistics and that bring rigor to learning. These include processes like investigating, representing, connecting, generalizing, and explaining and justifying.

At Frasertown School, we are committed to a structured approach to teaching and learning that aligns with this new curriculum. Our implementation is guided by the principles of maths mastery, which builds deep conceptual understandings through carefully sequenced content and the use of material and pictorial representations before moving to abstract concepts. We ensure students have

opportunities to practise new knowledge and skills in different contexts and receive timely feedback to address any misconceptions.

Our teachers use explicit teaching, where concepts are explained thoroughly and clearly, with planned purposes for each lesson. This involves modelling, guided practice, and a gradual handover of responsibility to students for their independent practice. We also intentionally incorporate literacy skills through verbal representations, vocabulary, word problems, and student explanations and justifications to enrich learning.

We plan for daily mathematics lessons, averaging about an hour a day, which include a structured approach: a 'getting started' introduction, dedicated working time, and a 'connect and reflect' summary. We link learning to prior knowledge, introduce new concepts using engaging activities, and provide opportunities for students to develop and consolidate their understanding through various tasks.

The new curriculum emphasizes the importance of developing positive relationships with maths by building confidence, engaging with students' interests, and reinforcing that maths knowledge develops with effort. We create an inclusive learning environment where all students feel supported to contribute and take risks, and we connect maths tasks to students' languages and cultures.

Assessment is an ongoing process, informing our teaching and helping us to understand students' learning needs. We use standardised tools for students in Years 3-8 twice yearly - which we already do. This helps us monitor progress and provide targeted support where needed.

We believe that this new curriculum provides a strong foundation for our students in mathematics and statistics, equipping them with the skills and understanding they need to thrive in an increasingly complex world. We look forward to working with our students and you, our whānau, on this exciting journey.

Structured Literacy Learning

Sounds and Names of Letters

This is great for early literacy development. Children are getting a solid foundation by practicing letter sounds and names. Homework books serve as a valuable tool for reinforcement.

The class have painted wonderful portraits of themselves and have played around with paint using sponges and cotton wool








