Saul's Transformation—A Changed Heart

Family Devotion: Saul's Transformation—A Changed Heart

Memory Verse: If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new is here!" – 2 Corinthians 5:17

Introduction

Have you ever made a big change in your life? Maybe you learned to be kinder, more patient, or more forgiving. In today's devotion, we'll learn about Saul, a man who went from being an enemy of Jesus to one of His greatest followers.

Read: Acts 9:1-19

Saul was a religious leader who believed Christians were dangerous. He hurt them, arrested them, and even approved of their deaths. But on his way to Damascus, everything changed. A bright light flashed, and Saul fell to the ground. He heard Jesus say, "Saul, why are you persecuting me?" Saul became blind. This physical blindness showed his spiritual blindness—he had been fighting against the truth. God sent Ananias to help. Even though Ananias was afraid, he obeyed God and went to Saul. Saul's sight was restored, and he was baptized! He was no longer an enemy of Jesus but His follower. He later became known as Paul and spent his life sharing the Good News.

Discussion Questions

How do you think Saul felt when he realised he was wrong?

What can we learn from Ananias about trusting God?

How does this story show that no one is beyond God's love?

Application

God can change anyone's heart, no matter their past. We should pray for others, even those who don't know Jesus yet. Like Ananias, we should listen to God and be ready to help others grow in faith.

Prayer

Dear Jesus, thank You for loving us and changing our hearts. Just like You changed Saul, help us to follow You every day. Give us courage like Ananias to obey You, even when it's hard. Help us to love and pray for others, knowing You can change any heart. Amen.
