## Family Devotion – God Brings New Beginnings

This term I'm going to write using the format of:

- 1)Something to **think** about
- 2) Something to **do**
- 3)Something to **pray** about.

Joseph's story is a powerful reminder that God can take even the hardest parts of our lives and weave them into His good plan. As a teenager, Joseph was betrayed by his brothers, sold into slavery, and taken far from home. It looked like the end of his dreams. Yet, through all the twists and turns—whether in prison, in Pharaoh's palace, or during famine—God was at work.

Years later, Joseph could say to his brothers, "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good, to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives" (Genesis 50:20).

What looked like a painful ending was really the beginning of something new. God used Joseph's suffering to prepare him for leadership and to bring hope to many. His story reminds us that unfair treatment, setbacks, or even deep hurts cannot stop God's purpose for our lives.

### Think

Have you ever experienced something that felt unfair or painful, but later saw how God brought good out of it? How might God be at work in the challenges you're facing now?

### Do

As a family, draw or write a "puzzle piece" on paper. On one side, write or sketch a difficulty you've faced (big or small). On the other side, write or draw how God might use that situation for good, even if you can't see it yet. Put the pieces together on the fridge as a reminder that God sees the whole picture.

### Pray

Lord God, thank You that You are always working for good, even when life feels unfair or hard. Help us to trust that You can turn difficult endings into new beginnings. Give us hope and patience as we wait for Your plan to unfold. Amen.
