## From Fearful to Faithful: Moses' Journey of Trust

**Bible Passage:** Exodus 3:11-12 – But Moses said to God, “Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?” And God said, “I will be with you.”

Moses didn't start as the bold leader we often imagine. When God called him from the burning bush, Moses was hesitant and full of excuses. Who am I? What if they don't believe me? I am not a good speaker! (Exodus 3-4). Fear gripped his heart. He focused on his weaknesses rather than on God's strength.

Yet, God didn't choose Moses because of his skills—He chose him because He had a plan. With patience, God reassured Moses, “I will be with you.” Step by step, Moses moved from fear to faith. He confronted Pharaoh, led the Israelites through the Red Sea, and became one of the greatest leaders in history. His confidence didn't come from himself, but from trusting God's presence and power.

### **Family Discussion:**

Have you ever felt afraid to do something God wants you to do?

What excuses do we sometimes make when we don't want to obey God?

How can we remind ourselves that God is with us, just as He was with Moses?

### **Faith in Action:**

This week, encourage each family member to take one step of faith. It could be speaking kindly to someone, praying out loud, or standing up for what is right.

Remember, God doesn't ask us to be perfect—He asks us to trust Him.

### **Prayer:**

Lord, just as You were with Moses, be with us. Help us trust You, even when we feel afraid. Strengthen us to follow Your call with faith. Amen.
