Family Devotion: From Orphan to Queen - For a Purpose

Scripture Focus: Esther 4:14 – "And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?"

Esther's story is like a fairy tale with a divine twist. She began life as an orphan – unseen, unknown, and unlikely to make history. But God had a plan.

Raised by her cousin Mordecai in a foreign land, Esther was chosen to become queen of Persia – a position of great honour but also great risk. She didn't become queen by accident. God placed her there for such a time as this - to save her people from destruction.

Her journey reminds us that life has seasons:

- A season of obscurity, where it seems we're unnoticed.
- A season of opportunity, where unexpected doors open.
- A season of courage, where we must choose to step up.

Esther could have stayed silent, safe in the palace. But she chose bravery over comfort. With wisdom and faith, she approached the king – risking her life to stand for what was right.
