Seasons of Change — From Lost to Found

Based on Luke 15:1-7

Have you ever lost something really important? A favourite toy? A pet? That panicked, searching feeling can be overwhelming. Now imagine how you'd feel if you found it again—relief, joy, maybe even a happy dance!

In Luke 15, Jesus tells the story of a shepherd who has 100 sheep. One day, he notices that one is missing. Instead of shrugging and saying, "Well, I've still got 99," the shepherd leaves the flock and goes after the one that's lost. He searches high and low until he finds it. Then what? He doesn't scold it—he rejoices! He lifts it onto his shoulders and celebrates. He even calls his friends to share in his joy.

This parable gives us a beautiful picture of God's heart. He is not content with just the 99; He longs for the one. That one might be the person who's walked away from faith, the child who feels forgotten, the adult who's made a mess of things—or even us, when we feel a bit lost inside.

God doesn't write people off. Instead, like the shepherd, He searches, calls, and welcomes. Jesus is the Good Shepherd who came to find and rescue the lost.

In seasons of change—growing up, shifting friendships, moving homes, or just life being a bit messy—this story reminds us: God sees you. God seeks you. God celebrates when you are found.

Take time as a family this week to thank God for His loving heart. If someone you know feels a bit "lost," pray for them together. And remember—no one is too far gone for God's love to reach.

Whakataukī: He waka eke noa — We're all in this together. And Jesus is the one steering the boat.
