A Season of Waiting and Renewal

Scripture: Genesis 8-9

Have you ever had to wait a really long time for something? Maybe a holiday, a birthday, or for the rain to stop so you could go outside? Imagine Noah—he waited inside the ark for over a year! That's a long time with a lot of animals and no fresh air.

God asked Noah to build the ark because Noah walked with God and listened to Him. While everyone else ignored God's ways, Noah chose to obey. When the rains came and the floodwaters rose, Noah and his family were safe—but they still had to wait. Wait through the storm. Wait for the water to go down. Wait for God's next instructions.

Sometimes, we go through our own "storms"—hard times that don't seem to end. It might be change, disappointment, or just uncertainty. But like with Noah, God is always doing something new, even when we can't see it yet.

Eventually, the ark came to rest. Noah stepped out into a brand new world. God made a covenant with him and placed a rainbow in the sky as a promise: never again would the earth be destroyed by flood. The rainbow was a sign of mercy, hope, and God's faithfulness.

Discussion Questions:

Have you ever gone through a season of waiting? What did you learn?

How can we remind ourselves of God's promises when life feels uncertain?

Prayer:

Lord, help us to trust You when we have to wait. Thank You for being with us through the storms and for giving us hope for new beginnings. Help us to walk in



obedience, just like Noah. Amen.
