Trusting in God's Power – The Changing of Water into Wine

Scripture: John 2:1-11

Theme: Jesus' first miracle shows His power to transform and renew. Just as He changed water into wine, He can bring change and new beginnings into our lives.

Opening Thought: Have you ever faced a situation that seemed impossible? Maybe you felt like there was no solution or no way forward. In today's devotion, we will see how Jesus turned an ordinary moment into something extraordinary, revealing His power and reminding us to trust Him in every situation.

Bible Passage: Read John 2:1-11 together. In this story, Jesus attends a wedding with His disciples and His mother, Mary. When the wine runs out, Mary brings the need to Jesus. Though His time had not yet come, He instructs the servants to fill six large stone jars with water. Then, in a miraculous moment, He transforms the water into the best wine of the feast!

Discussion Questions:

Why do you think Jesus chose a wedding to perform His first miracle?

What do you learn about Mary's faith in this passage?

How do you think the servants felt when they saw water turn into wine?

In what areas of your life do you need to trust Jesus to bring transformation?

Life Application: Just as Jesus transformed water into wine, He can change our hearts, our circumstances, and our future. When we trust Him, we allow His power to work in our lives. If you're facing a challenge, take a moment to pray and ask Jesus to help you trust Him for His perfect timing and provision.

Prayer: Dear Jesus, thank You for showing us Your power through this miracle. Help us to trust You in every situation, even when things seem impossible. Change our hearts and renew our faith in You. Amen.

Family Challenge: This week, find a way to be a blessing to someone else. Just as Jesus brought joy to the wedding guests, how can you bring encouragement to someone who needs it? Maybe it's a kind word, a thoughtful act, or a prayer for a friend. Let's be part of God's work in bringing transformation to others!
