From Pit to Palace

Scripture: Genesis 50:20 – "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives."

Have you ever had a day (or even a whole season!) where things just seemed to go from bad to worse? Joseph knew all about that. He was thrown into a pit by his own brothers, sold into slavery, falsely accused, and locked in prison. Not exactly the path most of us would expect for someone described as faithful and favoured by God!

And yet, through each painful twist and turn, God was doing something remarkable. Joseph didn't know what the future held, but he continued to honour God in every place he found himself — even when things didn't make sense.

Eventually, Joseph was lifted out of prison and given a powerful role in Egypt. God used him to save lives during a terrible famine — including the very family who had once betrayed him. The pit wasn't the end of Joseph's story. Neither was slavery or prison. Each season was part of God's bigger picture.
