Thank you to Nolan who read the names of former pupils and a teacher of Roseneath School who gave their lives in both world wars and Sophia who read a poem. Some of the names recited are the 13 which are inscribed on the monument at the top of the driveway which was the first in Wellington.

We held our Cross Country run at school at the end of last term and the children are still practicing for the Central Zone event on 21 May. Thank you to Jemima for the organisation of this event and good luck to all those taking part. The participants will have a practice run over the McAllister Park course before the event.

How Your Children Copy W * What You Do * *

As parents, your actions speak louder than your words.

Telling kids to "be kind" doesn't stick much if they see you being rude to others. The behavior you model is what your kids will learn, not just what you tell them to do.

For example...

Your child WILL remember:		They WON'T remember:
The ways you treat a store assistant, a taxi driver, or a waiter.	•	When you say "Please be kind!"
How you react to someone cutting you off in traffic.	+	When you say "Don't be rude!"
How you stare at your phone and do not pay attention to conversations.	+	When you say: "Put your iPad away, I'm talking to you."
How you gossip and complain about others.	+	When you say: "It's not okay to talk about others like that."
The ways you talk negatively about your body.	+	When you tell them, "You need to love yourself!"
How you get angry and raise your voice.	+	When you tell them, "You need to calm down!"

Our children live what they see, not what they are told.

It's not about being perfect but about being mindful that kids will likely copy what you do. So, if you show kindness, respect, and love for yourself, you're setting an example for how they should also treat others and how they should treat themselves.


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Community Notices
