Te Reo o te Wiki

Mihimihi and Pepeha at Te Wai Hirere/Roseneath School

All of our students will have the opportunity to learn the connections between themselves, their whānau, and the natural landmarks around them by learning to introduce themselves with a mihimihi.

For our students who whakapapa Māori, they learn their own pepeha, using their whānau information to acknowledge the land and waters of their iwi.

These are a way of introducing ourselves linking who we are to the people and places that are important to us.

An explanation is found with this link: Ko wai to pepeha? What is your pepeha?

At Roseneath we have a school minimini which the children learn and add to as they progress through the school. (some examples are below)

Anything after the BUT is often an attempt to avoid responsibility.

PERSONAL ACCOUNTABILITY MEANS ELIMINATING "YOU" STATEMENTS.

"YOU made me so angry."



There's no blaming others for our behaviour and emotions. We take responsibility for both.

Personal accountability does NOT mean you aren't allowing your child to explain what happened. Your child explains what happened WHILE taking responsibility for their actions.

Tell your child — "Personal accountability is a superpower that can help you always be in charge of your life."

Start a culture of accountability in your family so your children have the skills they need to take ownership of their lives.

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Floorball Information - Years 1 - 8

General floorball info:

School teams consist of 3 field players and 1 goalie on the court.

There is a minimum of 4 players per team (7 is ideal).

Year 1/2 grade has slightly different rules and set up – 4 stick players and no goalies.

Floorball sticks for field players and helmet plus knee pads for goalies will be provided.

a) Primary and Intermediate League DATES

Futsal Information Years 1-8

What is Futsal?

Futsal is the only FIFA and NZ Football approved version of five-aside football and the world's fastest growing indoor sport. The name futsal is derived from the Portuguese words futebol (football) and sala (hall). Futsal is a small-sided – 5v5 – game played with a smaller (size 3 or 4) low bounce ball, on a basketball sized court without rebound walls or nets. It is a game which combines fun, creativity, speed, technique, teamwork and quick thinking. NZF Futsal has been designed to complement New Zealand Football's existing programmes and promote and improve participation in football in New Zealand.
