How to Reduce Power Struggles



Are you tired of constant arguments when it's time for your child to wear a coat, tidy up, or brush their teeth?



Here are some things you can do to really make a difference:

Set Non-Negotiables:

Start by defining a list of "non-negotiables." These are the essential tasks that your child must complete, like brushing their teeth. Everything else can be a gradual work in progress. Remember, your child needs to be able to assert themselves and say no, so give them that space.

Offer Choices:

Instead of commanding your child to do something, provide options. For instance, ask, "Do you want to clean up by yourself, or would you like some help?" This approach empowers your child by giving them a sense of control while still conveying your expectations.

Find Mutual Wins:

Explore solutions where both you and your child can win. When facing resistance, ask, "How can we both win in this situation?" For example, if getting dressed for school is a struggle, consider allowing your child to choose their outfit the night before and wear it to bed. This approach might create a compromise that eliminates morning battles.

Encourage Open Communication:

Sometimes, it helps to ask your child why they're reluctant to do something. Give them a chance to express themselves without judgment. There could be underlying reasons they're not sharing. By listening, you show that you care and respect their feelings.

Maintain Connection:

Remember, our parenting rules have good intentions, but power struggles can hinder progress. Focus on staying connected with your child. Aim for solutions that strengthen your bond and allow you both to achieve your goals.

Floorball Information - Years 1 - 8

General floorball info:

School teams consist of 3 field players and 1 goalie on the court.

There is a **minimum of 4 players per team** (7 is ideal).

Year 1/2 grade has slightly different rules and set up – 4 stick players and no goalies.

Floorball **sticks for field players and helmet plus knee pads for goalies will be provided.**

a) Primary and Intermediate League DATES

The floorball league dates and times have not been posted yet. More information will be sent out when the registrations are open.

Primary League (years 1 - 6) Tuesday 17th October - Tuesday 13th December

Intermediate League (years 7 - 8) Thursday 19th October - Thursday 7th December

Game TIMES

Games are played **between 3.30pm and 7pm**, with the younger students playing the earlier games, the older students the later games.

Year 7 and 8 students

There were only 3 students interested in playing when I asked each class. There is both a Competitive Grade (must know the rules, game play and be prepared to play against teams that train regularly) and a Social Grade (students who are still learning and want to have some fun).

Futsal Information Years 1-8

What is Futsal?

Futsal is the only FIFA and NZ Football approved version of five-a-side football and the world's fastest growing indoor sport. The name futsal is derived from the Portuguese words futebol (football) and sala (hall). Futsal is a small-sided – 5v5 – game played with a smaller (size 3 or 4) low bounce ball, on a basketball sized court without rebound walls or nets. It is a game which combines fun, creativity, speed, technique, teamwork and quick thinking. NZF Futsal has been designed to complement New Zealand Football's existing programmes and promote and improve participation in football in New Zealand.

Time: Saturday mornings during Term 4. Game times will vary from year to year depending on the number of teams.

If there are more than 16 teams in the year 3 & 4 grade, two rounds will be necessary. The first round will run from 12.00pm to 1.00pm. If required, a second round will run from 1.30pm to 2.30pm.
