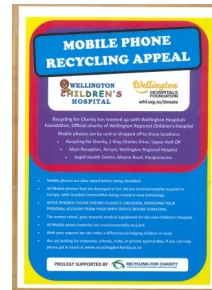

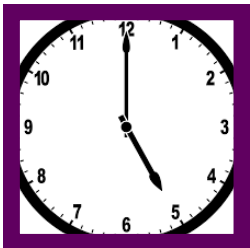

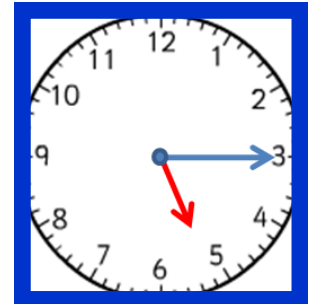

Sharing Lower Deck's Item

We are going to have a school show. There will be Ngāke, Whātaimai, Kahui Maunga and a bird. The taniwha will swim and swim then Ngāke will rage and curl up into a ball and pretend to smash through the rocks. Whātaimai will watch his rage.

Years passed then Whātaimai will try to break free, but he fails.

Whātaimai will die and turn into a spirit. That's when someone will lead the dancers who were Ngāke out, then slowly Whātaimai's spirit will rise, then they will try to do a bird pose.

We will wear gloves and masks and take our shoes and socks off.

There is music too: the songs were, Ka Hura, I Want to Break Free, I Never Felt So Alone, Ruai-moko and Touch.

Your family is allowed to come. You can sleep in after the show is finished, if you go to them both because some will take a long time so you might get to bed late.

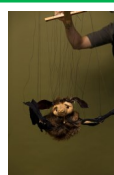
Puppet Show
