Stress and parenting: a note from Whaea Lynda


As a parent I know that there isn't much on this earth that upsets or stresses us more than when our children may be harmed or upset.

If something happens at school and your child is upset or thinks there is some injustice: please come and talk to the class teacher as a first step. If things are not resolved, then you are welcome to make a time to meet with me. Sometimes things that happen at school are misunderstood by our children or we only hear part of the story. Issues can usually be sorted with a face-to-face chat with the teacher.

At home our own stress and big emotions or past hurt can sometimes get in the way of positive parenting. As parents and teachers, we need to 'put our own oxygen masks on first': that is, we need to attend to our own regulation and calm our emotions so that we can help our children to dial down their own big feelings and behaviours.

Through my work in the trauma-informed kaupapa over the years I have got to know Matt and Sarah Brown. Matt can be found on the "My Father's Barber" YouTube clip. Matt is an excellent resource person and wealth of information for Dads who have dealt with hard things and are now raising children. He has created an online platform for fathers: https://innerboy.nz/

He has written *She is not your rehab* and with his partner Sarah has written *This is not yours to carry* - for children. Copies of which we have been gifted for our senior students.





NZEI Strike Day - Thursday 23 October - School Closed



Unless the government and the union agree on new collective agreements for teachers, support staff and principals, we will be striking on 23 October.

The three groups all have different claims and requests as part of their collective agreement but the government's response to the different groups has been similar:

- Pay offers that are less than inflation increases
- No recognition of extra support for children with additional needs
- No recognition of the challenges of our jobs in these current difficult times, for example the overwhelming pace of curriculum and education policy changes.

We need the best people we can get working with our tamariki: the current government offers will not attract or retain skilled and dedicated educators.

You're welcome to come and support us as we join the thousands of principals, teachers, teacher aides, firefighters, doctors, nurses, midwives, dentists and other healthcare workers striking in the 'mega strike' at Parliament.

This will be NZ's biggest strike since the Waterfront Dispute of 1951 or the Great Strike of 1913.
