New opportunities this year.

Our school is now a member of Manaiakalani schools across New Zealand. We are also adopting the E Tū Tāngata empowerment approach to work to achieve goals without criticism.

We are also introducing more opportunities for Tuakana Teina: a model for buddy systems. An older or more expert tuakana helps and guides a younger or less expert teina. This could also be a younger student who is skilled or has knowledge assisting an older student.

The Manaiakalani Programme (TMP) provides our students the opportunity to achieve significant improvements in student outcomes, realising learners' potential and enabling digital citizenship.

Our school is working with a group of schools the country facilitators and specialists support the implementation of the Manaiakalani Programme locally in Tāmaki and around the country, through the Manaiakalani Programme.

We are a member of the Te Purapura Ngātahi o Manaiakalani cluster of schools across the country. This cluster of schools is considered a group of schools joined together by online links. We are fortunate our facilitator, Vicki Archer, lives in Christchurch so she will be joining us each Monday to work within our school.
