If we are unable to secure enough volunteers, swimming will have to be cancelled due to the financial constraints. The cost of the bus for 10 days would be approximately \$2,400.00.

Waimakariri Camp (Wednesday 22nd October - Friday 24th October) - Parent helpers needed




Subsidised home internet for our school community
