

This term we have our School Cross Country coming up. Students will be showing their house pride by dressing in their fun house colours and taking part in this exciting run. We're looking forward to seeing the determination, encouragement and house spirit that this event will inspire across the school.

For our Year 5–8 students, we have some fantastic learning trips planned. First, we'll be heading to the Rangiriri trenches to explore an important part of our local Waikato history, deepening our understanding of the past and the stories of our whenua. Following this, students will attend the Koroneihana celebrations, a special opportunity to experience tikanga Maaori in action and connect with the rich cultural heritage of our community. These experiences will provide meaningful, hands-on learning that supports our curriculum and grows our students' understanding of identity and place.

Each Monday, our kura gathers for a PB4L assembly, where this term we are focusing on the value of Wairua Pai – having a positive spirit. It has been wonderful to see students showing bravery, kindness, and respectful behaviour in all areas of school life.Our Friday award assemblies are held every second week on odd weeks, and our school newsletter comes out on even weeks, helping keep whaanau informed and connected.

A friendly reminder that we have updated our student early sign-out procedures. For the safety of our tamariki, only those listed as authorised will be allowed to collect your child during school hours. If your circumstances change or you haven't yet updated your authorised contacts, please get in touch with the office.

Attending school every day, all day gives your child the best chance to succeed. Did you know:

Missing just 1 day every 2 weeks adds up to 20 full school days across a year - that's 4 weeks of lost learning.

Being 10 minutes late each day adds up to over 6 hours of missed learning every term.
