

School Closure - Strike Action Thursday, October 23rd

It is highly likely that Primary School teachers, admin staff and teacher aides/support staff who are part of the NZEI union will be participating in a mass strike on **Thursday 23rd of October.**

This closure is necessary because most of our staff—including teachers, administration, and teacher aides—are part of the NZEI union and have collectively voted to strike. With so few staff remaining, it is simply unsafe and legally impossible for us to open the school and properly supervise students.

You **must** arrange alternative care for your child for the full day on **Thursday, October 23rd.** The school will not be open for supervision.

This nationwide decision is a collective action by union members to support contract negotiations. This action may also involve staff from secondary schools, nurses, senior doctors, dentists and other services. We are giving you this notice now so you have adequate time to plan.

We will only contact you again if a significant breakthrough in negotiations occurs before the 23rd.
