Colin's Kōrero

Teacher Only Day Last Week

The focus for our Teacher Only Day last Friday was "Supporting Students Managing Trauma." Our presenter was Kathryn Berkett, who is a world authority on this topic. This was a most worthwhile day for us as we collectively learned a great deal about the effects of trauma on people, or why some students may be "over-sensitised." Two of the key messages I need to share are;

- Hand-held devices being used for more than 30 minutes daily can have a significant negative
 effect on children. More than we realised. The negative effects are both mental and physical.
 Brain development is restricted with regular use and children's muscle development is delayed
 with irregular and inconsistent movement. The advice I share with you is to ensure that your
 children are physically active at regular intervals during the day and that devices are used
 sparingly
- Children, and adults, can become over-sensitised for a multitude of reasons. Mostly from an incident or series of incidents that place them in a "primitive state." When in this state a person is unable to rationalise or make reasoned choices. We need to support people in this state by giving them time and space to re-regulate in order for them to function normally again

Field Upgrade

Our main school playing field requires a make-over. The surface is very hard with an irregular surface, rather than being smooth with a level surface. We need a plan to upgrade it. I am aware that we have some parents and whānau who may have access to either the knowledge about how to upgrade it or the machinery to help do the job. I would appreciate hearing from anyone who can help us come up with a plan.





Whānau Focus

Next week is the mid-week of our first term for 2025. The first 5 weeks have certainly flown by. Our focus for next week is on family and recreation. We avoid having after-school meetings during this week and we encourage our families to plan to have some fun together during the week. Despite the increase in curriculum demands our teachers are dealing with this term we hope that our students will enjoy some fun activities with their classmates throughout the week.

Please note start times may alter dependent on time it takes for previous races, registration numbers and weather conditions. All competitors should be ready to start from 9.30am onwards and have their bikes in the transition area by 9.15am. Children will be given a 10 minute call before each race is to start.

2x types pumpkin, cucumber, tomatoes, strawberries, corn and hue.







Junior tennis is on every FRIDAY during Term 1 @ Manuka Cres.


Junior club days are about fun games, with ball and court sizes adjusted for different age groups, and match play when ready. You do not need any equipment to start, just show up and have a go!

- 3.30-5.00: Secondary School and those younger players able to play full matches with normal balls.







MISSING LUNCH PROCEDURE

- Normal procedure when there is a problem with lunches is that the child would go to the office as soon as they notice a problem.

LUNCH REMINDERS

Going Home at 3pm

We have a problem at the moment with a number of students returning to school after 3pm, either on bikes, scooters, skateboards etc. The school is a busy place for teachers after school, with meetings going on most days, as well as parent meetings and onsite after school care etc.

We respectfully request that once students go home, that they do not come back until the next day! There is no supervision after school, and we have had some near misses with children on bikes etc.

If your child has a sports practice, they need to go home and come back at the appropriate time.
