Westbrook Art Exhibition: Our first-ever "Westbrook School Art Exhibition" was held last week. Every student in the school had their art on display. We had a steady stream of parents and whānau visit the display over the two days. Thanks to the generosity of those who visited and made a donation, we received \$424.00 to help offset the costs of hosting the exhibition. Thanks also to the very generous bids from a number of whānau we also received just over \$1,000.00 for the artworks produced by our staff. This will be used for future art projects. Our thanks goes to the Arts Professional Learning Team for all their hard work in planning and presenting of the exhibition. This took many hours, and we do appreciate their efforts.

Marae visits: Our Maori Professional Learning Group of teachers planned the Marae experience visits that our students are currently enjoying. These began last week with our Year 1 Team heading down to the Marae on Thursday, and will conclude this Thursday when our Year 5 students spend their day at the Marae. Our students participated in a semi-formal whakatau welcome, as well as spending time in the Wharenui learning games, learning about Marae protocols, or engaging in craft activities, such as poi making. Many thanks to our Maori PLG and all the staff who have supported this excellent learning opportunity for our tamariki.

BOT Elections: Voting closes at 4pm today for this year's Board of Trustees elections. We have had around 15% of eligible parents and caregivers vote over the past few weeks. This is better than the national average. The results will be announced next week.

Wacky Hair Day: This Friday is Westbrook's Wacky Hair Day. This is an annual fundraiser for Child Health Research. This year, we are hosting this occasion in memory of Kodie Diamond. 



Drop Off and Pick Up

The children have adapted to our safe system for dropping children at school and picking them up after school. This is generally working well, however we still have some concerns with drivers leaving cars unattended and parking in our drop off/pick up zone.
