Kia ora !

Ko Jess toku ingoa.

Nō Te Atihau Nui a Pāpārangi nō Tuwharetoa ahau.

I have 4 tamariki and I have lived in and out of Timaru since I was 14. About 3 years ago I stood on stage for regionals in Te Tau Ihu for Kia Ngāwari ki mua after a 20 year gap. I was instantly reminded of a passion I used to experience throughout primary and intermediate growing up in the Wairarapa.

This is only my 2nd year holding space for tamariki and I've found it to be a profound privilege that allows me to share the rich tapestry of Māori culture, dance, and song with others. It's about more than just steps and music; it's about passing down traditions through waiata and kemu māori and igniting a sense of manaakitanga, whanaungatanga and kotahitanga. The spirit, resilience and raw emotion that infuse kapa haka performances are a testament to the depth of Maori heritage, resonating across time and generations. Witnessing the joy and pride on the faces of those who learn and celebrate this art form is a truly moving experience. It embodies the communal strength and unity that transcends barriers, making the journey of teaching kapa haka an immensely fulfilling one.

I open the door to all whānau who wish to come and join in the fun.

A huge thank you to our home and school for helping to fund the printing of our 'Tarahaoa - Local Legend' book. This was retold by room 1 ākonga in 2020 and illustrated by Geraldine Primary ākonga in 2022. This incredible resource is in each classroom and in the school office.

Introducing Safer Speeds

Good news! The speed limits around your school are reducing. This will ensure the safety of our Timaru District students on their commute to and from school. As per the speed management plan that was approved earlier this year by The New Zealand Transport Agency: Waka Kotahi, we will be introducing a lower permanent or variable speed limit outside of schools and a few other high risk locations in our district. A variable speed limit means the road will have a electronic speed sign installed and it will flash the reduced speed when enforced, in this case during school drop off and pick up times. Please see the attached map showing what is planned for your school. All new speed limit signs are expected to be installed and enforced by July 1st 2024.
