Principal's Korero

Kia ora koutou whānau and welcome to our Pānui.

Geraldine Primary continues to be a thriving hub of opportunities and fun.

At the start of last week, we officially opened the inside of the ePod. Our school council, student leaders, room 4 and whānau were the first to get a glimpse of the incredible vaulted ceiling. During the week all students had the opportunity to spend 15 minutes inside the ePod, with the doors open and shut and with the lights on and off. This was an incredible experience. They were encouraged to explore their feelings and emotions. From next week the ePod will be open to teachers to use with their class. We will also be looking at how families can visit the ePod, after school, and our community during the weekend.

On Saturday 24th May, Mrs Leov and Mrs Wilcox accompanied James, Lachie, Josh, Ella and their whānau to Wellington to take part in the national finals of the Kids Lit Quiz. Our team was the youngest by a country mile, but did an excellent job in a pressurised quiz environment! They were beaten to the buzzer numerous times, but did answer a number of questions correctly. At the end of the quiz our team came in 11th place out of 18 teams. A fantastic achievement.

On Monday the whole school took part in the annual cross country. The weather did not disappoint and the sun kept shining. It is so great to see all children trying their best and striving to achieve their own personal goals. For some children this was just completing the course, whilst for others it was gaining a top placing. It was awesome to see so many of our whānau at the event too. A huge thank you to Mrs Hanrahan for her outstanding organisation and to the High School for allowing their year 10's to martial and run with the children.

At the end of this week Maia from South Canterbury netball visited GPS to put our senior students through a series of different and fun Netball skills sessions.

Yesterday Daphne Newcombe was our principal for the day. She ran a very tight ship. She visited every class, baked cakes for the staff, gave out gotchas during morning tea and lunch, taught room 1 and organised a staff v students netball game. All students arrived at school in non-school uniform, and lots came to watch the fiercely contested netball match, which was won convincingly by staff!

Over the last 6 weeks we have had Ben Robertson in room 1 completing his first teacher placement. It is great to see how he interacts positively with students, staff and whānau, bringing a sense of creativity and fun. Unfortunately, his placement has come to an end, but we would like to thank him for his positivity and mahi. However, we have managed to persuade him to take on the role as an in-school Children Mentor Support for 5 weeks, whilst he is waiting for his second placement to start. His duties will include:

- Supporting students to engage with their learning in class and provide collaborative solutions to enhance their educational and life outcomes.
- Fostering positive student teacher relationships.
- Working alongside teachers.
- Working with students to enable them to use social, emotional and regulation skills.
- Support students to be positive when following the GPS values processes.
- Teach GPS kapa haka and kahui ako kapa haka.

A huge thank you to Mrs Robertson, Mrs Leov and Miss Bathgate for organising and running through many auditions. We had many students audition for major roles and I know the teachers found it very challenging to select. It is great to see so many students put themselves forward. Well done to all and I am excited to watch the production take shape over the next two terms.

Thank you whānau for supporting our maths teacher only day. We understand that this does cause some inconvenience.

Lastly, thank you for your many kind messages, gifts and aroha towards Jodi. She is so grateful for your manaakitanga.


