Principal's Kōrero

Kia ora koutou whānau and welcome to our Pānui.

Over the past few newsletters, I've shared my journey with an ADHD diagnosis and why celebrating our differences is so important. This week our lunchtime whānau competitions have reminded me again of the power of sport — not just physically, but socially and emotionally too.

Years 5–6 have been playing cricket at the Domain, Years 3–4 have taken on Ki ō Rahi, and Years 1–2 have enjoyed fun relays. I've been helping with the cricket games, and it's been wonderful seeing so many tamariki step outside their comfort zone and challenge themselves.

One moment really stood out.

Alilia Hansen took a brilliant catch while keeping wicket — her face lit up with pride, her teammates cheered, and later I overheard her excitedly telling her mum, "Today in cricket I caught someone out."

Another special moment was In Ki O Rahi where Jack Jones demonstrated his understanding of a brand new game. Jack received the ball and knew that he had to run to hit the pou before he scored his try. When his position changed he knew that he could only run within his zone to avoid giving the ball away to the other team.

That simple moment of joy, pride, and connection is why we do sport. It's not about certificates or external rewards — it's the intrinsic feeling of success, the sense of "I did it," that shapes confidence and helps build strong, resilient young people.

These moments matter. They stay with us. And they help our tamariki grow into capable, connected, and confident citizens of our community.

Our whānau leaders and head students have driven this week's lunchtime games. Their passion and initiative made these competitions possible. When I asked them what legacy they wanted to leave, they said, "more competitions for all year groups." They are a pleasure to work with and always have GPS at heart.

On Tuesday I took four Year 5–6 teams to Timaru for the Caroline Bay Relay. Sixteen students represented our kura with pride, showing determination and teamwork in 27-degree heat. A special mention to our girls team — Krystal, Hosana, Bethany and Chloe — who placed second overall, just behind Woodbury. Their sportsmanship stood out as they cheered and celebrated alongside Woodbury during the trophy presentation.

On Wednesday we hosted our final mix and mingle for the term. I was blown away by the number of whānau who came along. The afternoon began with fun relay races organised by Lilah, Ella and Lucy, followed by a lively whānau tug of war. The chance for families to connect afterwards was a real highlight. A huge thank you to Renee, Mel, Suzi and Sheree, parent members of our community engagement group, for their energy and creativity.
