I was fortunate to accompany the mohio group to the raptor centre in Timaru. For those that don't know, our mohio group is our Geraldine Primary extension group and is made up of 12 Year 6 and Year 5 students. This term they have been learning about bird adaptations and this trip was an opportunity to use and develop their knowledge and understanding further. Most of the students plucked up courage to allow a hawk to stand on their gloved hand. The trip finished with us visiting the South Canterbury museum and being exposed to more native, endemic and introduced bird species. A huge thanks to Mrs Hanrahan for organising the trip and teaching the students.

On Tuesday 29th August I took Caitlyn, Nikau, Caty and Sandro to the unveiling of the Charles III plaque and tree at Todd Park. All four represented our school with pride. Nikau and Caitlyn delivered a personal and touching speech that showed their knowledge and passion for the monarchy.


