- 3. Use email address and new password to enter Portal

How do I log into the edge Mobile App?

- Downloaded from either Play Store (Android) or App Store (iOS). Search for MUSAC edge.
- 2. Once installed, make up a 4 digit pin.
- 3. Type in the email address you have supplied to the school. Click the 'Reset password' link and an email will be sent to you that includes a link allowing you to create your own password.
- 4. Use email address and new password to enter the edge Mobile App.




When: Tuesdays in Terms 1 & 4, from 10am-12.15pm.


