It is amazing to think that we are already over half way through Term 2. Time seems to fly when you work in a busy and bustling environment, and we are so blessed to be able to come to work each day to serve your beautiful tamaiti. We are really hitting the winter bug season and this shows with lower attendance over the past few weeks. During these wet and cold months it is important to keep on top of living conditions. Our health nurse, Amy, also has a lot of information available to support whānau in this area.

Our children have been learning about some amazing topics in school recently. Our school inquiry has begun, with classes researching the theme of **Whakapuāwai** - taking actions to flourish and blossom into the future. Each class will be participating in a seed-to-plant competition and also developing skills of interest for their own personal growth. Ask your child what they are doing in class! Students have also been learning about how to handle a medical emergency with the support of **Hato Hone St John** this week. This is an important learning experience and something that will benefit our students if they are ever in a serious medical situation with friends and family.

As you know, culture and tradition are enormous aspects of the school community here at Ōtāhuhu Primary School. We are so blessed by the various cultural groups represented in our local population. Ōtāhuhu is really a melting pot of the world, and we celebrated this bright and bold in Week 4 with a Cultural Day. Students dressed in amazing traditional outfits and shared foods from their cultures with their classrooms. This was a fantastic way to begin the season of language weeks and other cultural events of significance, such as Matariki.

We are currently celebrating **Samoan Language Week**. This year's theme is **Ia malu lou sā. Folau i lagimā - A well-grounded self** is a successful self. This theme has been particularly poignant for us as a school and senior leadership team over the past few weeks as we have reflected on aiga (family) and the guiding influence of our matua (parents). We acknowledge all of our students' first teachers, which is you, the parents, and bless the influence that you have on your wonderful children. Thank you to Mrs Sini and the teachers and learning assistants in Tafa o Ata who continue to grace our school with their culture, traditions and values. 
