to our New Zealand curriculum.

We have been working all year to follow MOE instructions to implement the English and Maths curriculum. On Monday 20 Oct the final versions of the Maths and English curriculum were released and sadly the Maths curriculum has significant changes. This means work in schools will need to be redone. There are also more rushed changes coming with Science resources being sent out to schools for use in 2026, before we have a curriculum. We are expecting a draft before the end of the year, but we won't have a finished science curriculum until 2027.



We can't assume all kids have had the same life experiences to bring to their learning. That's why we provide many opportunities to learn in a hands on way first and let kids lead who know more than their friends.

We start with Magic Monday, where every child has a hands on learning experience. This is where we hear new language and connect it to what is happening around us.

After the activity, we then talk and write about what happened, what we saw, why it happened and make connections between new information and what it looks like in real life.

We can then talk and write about where else we might see this and make connections between the concepts we have learnt and the wider world around us.

Finally we are equipped with new learning and knowledge to apply to our learning across a range of contexts and future Magic Monday experiences.

What is this process important? It helps kids take abstract ideas and concepts and see them in action for greater depth of understanding and for long term memory retention.
