Justified Vs Unjustified Absences

As you will be aware, we need to take the student roll every school day and establish reasons for absences. There are two types of absences. A justified absence is when a student is away for a valid reason like illness, bereavement, or a family emergency. An unjustified absence is when a student is away without approval — for example, sleeping in, shopping trips, birthdays, or holidays during term time.

Unjustified absences are more concerning because they can signal disengagement and make it harder for us to support your child's learning and wellbeing. If a child has more than 10 unjustified absences in a term it is school policy to refer them to Attendance Services who will support whanau to improve attendance.
