
#### **Bus Behaviour**

Unfortunately, this term has not got off to a positive start for some of our Kaimai Kids who have let themselves and the school down with their behaviour on the bus. We take safety on our buses very seriously at Kaimai School and want all our students to be able to travel safely on the bus. On Wednesday, we had our New Zealand Police School Community Officer, Senior Constable Lis Chambers, talk with all our students to remind them about staying safe, especially on the bus. Whānau, we ask that you talk again with your child if they catch the bus to remind them of the appropriate behaviour. If we continue to have issues with behaviour that is disruptive or poses a safety risk, we may be left with no choice but to take action that could result in particular students losing their place on the school bus.

I love looking for and celebrating the positives, and that's made really easy for me at Kaimai School. It's really important to me personally that everyone feels happy and safe at our school, and I'm committed to ensuring that this is the case.


