PRINCIPAL/SLT HUI

During term 1, our principal/SLT hui discussed two key aspects of Kahui Ako for 2025:

- 1 Exploring a means of genuine mana whenua partnership with kura in the Matamata Kāhui Ako, that is sustainable. A partnership that recognises Ngāti Hauā, Ngāti Hinerangi and Ngāti Raukawa as co-governors of our Kāhui Ako and commits to working in partnership to realise the educational aspirations of Mana Whenua.
- 2 The importance of shared understanding around assessment with the current curriculum changes (see above statement)

WST HUI

Within School Teachers met as a group for the first time and looked at how their role, within their own school, aligns to the Kāhui Ako Strategic Plan. A key part of their role is communication with their community and sharing up and coming events. Touch base with your school's WST if you would like to know more about what is happening.

MATHS PLD STAFF ONLY DAY #1

Each school, within our Kāhui Ako, is at a different stage of its journey to implement the revised Maths Curriculum. This full Staff Only Day provided time and space for teachers, Principals and Learning Coaches to share and discuss Maths both within their own staff and also across schools. This was the first of 4 days, over the next 2 years, that will continue to build understanding and moderation between our schools. Although the day was aimed at Year O-8, it was great to have college teachers join us as this is an example of building on a students journey between our schools.

Thank you to everyone who entered a logo. We are pleased to share our new logo, which is a combination of all our entries and an explanation.

The circle shape symbolises unity and collaboration representing how we come together, support one another, and move forward as a connected community.
