Kia ora everyone

Welcome to our first newsletter for Term 4.

As usual, preparing for our upcoming Flower Show and Calf and Lamb Day has been the focus for us all during this first week back. The students have been working hard preparing their artwork for display and are looking forward to sharing these with you at the end of week 2.

We are pleased to report that over the holiday break we had some roofing work done here at school. A new roof was installed over the Whare Kea block, clear roof areas were replaced and all other roof areas were refixed. Luckily the weather did not hold the contractors up too much and all work was completed before school came back.

Targa Rally:

CALF & LAMB DAY – Judging commences at 10 am sharp, so please ensure that you are here and prepared well before this.

CHECK LIST FOR CALF CLUB DAY

- © Know your calf/lambs date of birth and breed.
- © NAIT Cards for calves. Calves must have approved NAIT ear tag
- © Electric fence standard/tie out peg for tying lambs up to. On a hot sunny day try and find some shade to tie your calf/lamb
- © Halter and lead for calves, collar and lead for lambs.
- © Brushes etc for grooming and cleaning calf/lamb.
- © Bucket for giving your calf a drink of water, bucket and or bottle for giving lambs a drink of water. If your lamb is still having a bottle during the day it is advisable to wait until after the 'most obvious pet' and 'leading' events to give your lamb its bottle. If this is not possible please feed your lamb out of sight of others waiting their turn by the ring (ie go around the front of the school buildings).
- © For children suitable footwear, sunhats/sunscreen, warm/waterproof jacket.
- © Group Day is at Te Kauwhata Domain on Thursday 23rd October 10.30am start. Any child who wishes to go to Group Day is encouraged to do so.

- © Details for Group Day Registration: Information to pre-register online for this was sent home with the last newsletter of Term 3. A reminder that registrations close on Sunday 19th October at 9.00am
- © Waikato A & P Show Boys & Girls Agricultural Club Day is on Friday 31st October: More information to follow at a later date.

NEW CALF EVENT:

We will be holding a new event this year for calves, it will be an obstacle course challenge (see diagram below).

This was trialled last year at the Lower Waikato Group Day and was a huge success so they have now incorporated it into their programme.

We have had a bridge built for the course for school and encourage those with calves to give it a go on the day as a fun event. We realise that people will not have a bridge at home but students may be able to practise by walking their calves over wooden boards or something similar you may have at home, weaving through poles stepping over ground poles and walking over a tarpaulin.
