Out of Zone Ballot

Our school operates an enrolment scheme (school zone). This scheme helps to protect our school from overcrowding. If you live within the school zone, then your child / children are guaranteed a place at Whakamārama School. Out-of-zone applications for enrolment are considered through a ballot system, and are subject to available places in suitable classes.

"Ko te manawa ū, kia rere, kia tīna"

The board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Whakamārama School for Term 1 2026. Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

An out-of-home zone application is to be completed and returned to the school office. Applications can be emailed upon request. The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-home zone places is 6 October 2025. The board has determined that 1 place is likely to be available for out-of-home zone students in Year 1.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, applications will be sorted against Ministry priority criteria. If a ballot is required it will be held on 7 October 2025. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.
