
### Parent/Family Information Evening - Mathematics and Statistics Curriculum Refresh

### **Holidays during Term Time**

Thank you to all parents and whānau who let the school know if your child will be away for a special holiday. These absences are recorded as *explained but unjustified*. Please note that the Ministry of Education automatically receives alerts when a student is absent for five or more days in a term.

Regular attendance makes a big difference to learning. Where possible, we encourage family trips to be planned during school holidays. If this is not possible, please email the principal at <a href="mailto:principal@whakamarama.school.nz">principal@whakamarama.school.nz</a> with your holiday details to request approved leave.

Both our school and the Ministry aim for ākonga to attend regularly—more than 90% of the time. This means only one day away each fortnight. Every day counts, and even small amounts of absence or lateness quickly add up.

### Avoid your child missing school - WHY?

- Educational disruption: regular attendance ensures continuous learning for your child. Missing school can cause your child to fall behind.
- Missed learning opportunities: your child misses out on important lessons and educational activities, which can lead to gaps in their knowledge and understanding.
- Disruption of routine: consistency is important for effective learning and behaviour.
- Impact on others: teachers spend extra time helping your child catch up, affecting the whole class.
- Assessments: missing school can lead to your child missing important goal setting assessments.

#### **Out of Zone Ballot**

Our school operates an enrolment scheme (school zone). This scheme helps to protect our school from overcrowding. If you live within the school zone, then your child / children are guaranteed a place at Whakamārama School. Out-of-zone applications for enrolment are considered through a ballot system, and are subject to available places in suitable classes.

The board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Whakamārama School for Term 1 2026. Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

An out-of-home zone application is to be completed and returned to the school office. Applications can be emailed upon request. **The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-home zone places is 6 October 2025**. The board has determined that 1 place is likely to be available for out-of-home zone students in Year 1.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, applications will be sorted against Ministry priority criteria. If a ballot is required it will be held on 7 October 2025. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.
