Out in the garden, our Room 1 learners were busy grabbing wheelbarrows of fresh mulch and delivering these to the new huarākau (fruit trees) planted last term. The garden team also got stuck into the weeds that had crept up over the break. Did you notice how hard they had worked before Show Day? Everything looked amazing!

There was plenty to harvest, and our tamariki in the kitchen did an amazing job using the produce we've grown to make delicious pesto and spinach pasta, muffins, and kale chips. The pasta was a clear favourite, with students lining up for seconds - and even thirds! Some fabulous cross-curricular connections were made too, as they brushed up on multiplying fractions while doubling and tripling recipes.

If you enjoy gardening, spending time in the kitchen, and working alongside young people, we'd love to have you join us as a Garden to Table volunteer.



Earthquakes STEAM Workshop

We were delighted to welcome STEAM Ed to our school on Friday 24 October for an exciting, hands-on learning experience. Through two, 1 ½ hour workshops, this free regional workshop gave our Year 5-8 learners the opportunity to build their problem-solving skills through the engineering design process while exploring real-world natural hazard challenges.

Our students took on the challenge of designing and testing earthquake-resilient structures. Combining science, technology, engineering, arts, and maths, they investigated the forces at work during an earthquake, then applied their learning to create an innovative model design. Our Year 5 - 8 learners thoroughly enjoyed these engaging and inspiring sessions that encouraged creativity and discovery.











Bay Conservation Alliance

What a busy and exciting day our Year 5–8 learners had at Puketoki Reserve with Bay Conservation Alliance on 20 October. Students learned about longfin and shortfin eels (tuna), carried out water quality testing, explored the bush, and examined the many insect species that live in the water. The day concluded with a refreshing bush walk. A huge thank you to the parents and whānau who joined us and supported our tamariki's learning.


















Colour Fun Run

Attendance Matters!



The Ministry of Education has a national goal of 80% of students attending school 90% of the time by 2030. This means a student is unable to miss more than one week per term or four weeks in a year.

Reasons for absence

If your child is going to be absent or late for school for any reason, please contact the school before 8.50am to advise us of their absence. You can ring the office, use Skool Loop (Skool Loop App is available for iphone & Android) or submit an online absenteeism form on our website. It is important that we have a reason for your child's absenteeism so that we are able to code the roll correctly. If your child is sick, we need more than 'My child is sick' as a response. It is very important to advise us of the reason for your child's absence otherwise their absence may be recorded as truant, and this information is now shared daily with the Ministry of Education. *Please help us out with this, otherwise valuable office time is used to follow up on children that are not at school.*

Holidays during Term Time

Regular attendance makes a big difference to learning. Where possible, we encourage family trips to be planned during school holidays. If this is not possible, please email the principal at principal@whakamarama.school.nz with your holiday details to request approved leave.
