




Small Schools Athletics

Out in the māra (garden), our garden team began growing kūmara slips. They popped kūmara into jars of water with toothpicks, and now they're sitting in the class windowsill, soaking up the sunshine. They are watching closely to see if we can grow enough kūmara to fill two









whole bathtubs. They also refreshed the compost - layering browns (cardboard) with greens (vege scraps and weeds),



adding water, and giving it a good flip for air. It's now working hard!

The school would like to thank Mrs Rosoman and Noah G's whānau who kindly donated topsoil. This valuable contribution will enrich our vegetable garden, helping to improve soil quality, support healthy plant growth, and boost our future harvests 😌
