School board members are active leaders in our schools. They have an important role of supporting strong professional leadership and ensuring effective teaching for all students through informed governance.



The school board elections are the opportunity to vote for candidates who will make a positive difference for our children's education. We need people willing to use their skills and experiences for the benefit of our students!

Come along to a board meeting. A great opportunity to learn how a school operates with the direction of the board members. It's not hard, get involved. We usually meet monthly. Please let us know if you wish to attend a meeting so that we can direct you to the attendance procedures of the general public.

### **Attendance Matters**

The school would like to thank parents and whānau for fostering the importance of attendance and ensuring that every day counts towards learning. Being engaged in learning matters, right from a child's first days in early learning, throughout primary schooling and secondary schooling. Aotearoa New Zealand's children need every opportunity to learn, participate, and flourish by regularly attending school.



The image below shows our school's provisional attendance figures for Term 1 this year. The Government has set a target: by 2030, 80% of students are present for more than 90% of the term.

We are a little off that figure, most of our absence reasons (73%) are for either sickness or term time holidays. We do encourage families to avoid taking family holidays outside of school holiday periods, but we also understand that this is not always possible.

#### Reasons for absence

If your child is going to be absent or late for school for any reason, please contact the school before 8.50am to advise us of their absence. If your child is sick, we need more than 'My child is sick' as a response. It is very important to advise us of the reason for your child's absence otherwise their absence may be recorded as truant, and this information is now shared daily with the Ministry of Education. A medical absence of more than three days requires a medical certificate to be presented to the school office or principal.



#### **Teacher Only Day**

Across the year, our teaching team will be undertaking structured mathematics professional learning development (PLD). Facilitators will be supporting our school and school leaders with the implementation of the revised Mathematics and Statistics area of the NZ curriculum for years 0-8.

A gentle reminder that our next day of learning is on **Friday 16th May 2025**. If you haven't already done so, please mark your calendar and make arrangements for your child / children.

Moving forward, our cluster schools (Pāhoia, Omokoroa Point and Omokoroa No.1) made a decision to complete our 4 days of Mathematics and Statistics PLD across 2025, instead of carrying this into 2026. Teacher only days have been calendared for Friday 19 September and Friday 14 November 2025. Please mark your calendar.
