School Absence Notification Policy

If your child will be absent or late for school for any reason, please contact the school before 8:50 am to inform us of their absence. Important Details:

- When reporting a sickness absence, please provide a specific reason rather than just saying "My child is sick" or "Medical."
- Without a clear reason, the absence may be recorded as truant.
- Absence information is shared daily with the Ministry of Education.
- If your child is absent due to illness for more than five days, a medical certificate must be presented to the school office or principal.
