PTA Congratulations

We are thrilled to announce that the Whakamārama School PTA has successfully secured a grant for the purchase of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) to be installed outside Whakamārama School.

AEDs are vital, life-saving devices that can make all the difference in the event of sudden cardiac arrest. They are designed to be simple to use - even for those without medical training. Currently, the closest AED is at Ōmokoroa No1 School, 6.8 km (about 8 minutes) away from the school. In a cardiac emergency, every minute counts: the chances of survival decrease by 10% for every minute without defibrillation and CPR. Using an AED within 3-5 minutes can dramatically improve survival rates.



Given that the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is a valuable community resource, it's important for us to have collective responsibility for its ongoing costs and maintenance.

efibrillators Save Lives After the AED is installed, we will be reaching out for community donations to help cover ongoing costs and maintenance. Together, we can ensure this life-saving device is always ready when it's needed most - making Whakamārama a safer place for everyone!

Year 7 / 8 Technology Classes


With the dedicated planning and delivery of our Year 7 / 8 technology programme from Alison and Tom, our Year 7 / 8 learners have had a great second term of learning.




Attendance Matters

The Code of Conduct applies:

- to all conduct, speech, and action, and includes emails, texts, phone calls, social media, or other communication
- while on school grounds or at another venue where students and/or staff are assembled for school purposes (such as a camp or sport).

Parents, whānau and caregivers, we thank you, or remind you for:

- treating everyone with respect
- **working together in partnership with staff for the benefit of students
- respecting and adhering to our school values
- **setting a good example for students at all times
- *following school procedures to handle any concerns or complaints
- *adhering to our school policies and procedures and legal requirements

As our school continues to grow and we warmly welcome new families, it's a good time to also share a gentle reminder about our school's procedure regarding parent concerns about behaviour.

Excerpt taken from our Behaviour Management overarching policy:

Parent Concerns about Student Behaviour

If a parent has a concern about an incident at school, the parent should contact the school and the school will deal with the concern. Parents should not approach other students or parents about school behaviour incidents. This also applies to incidents that occur out of school time or off school grounds but when students are still connected with the school e.g. at camp or on school trips, while wearing school uniform, or travelling to and from school.
