Planned Learning Space Improvements: Ngā Iti Kahurangi Project

Dates: Throughout the school holidays

Locations: Rooms 1, 2, 3 and Block A (main building)



During the upcoming school holidays, we are excited to undertake planned improvements in our learning spaces to enhance comfort, safety, and energy efficiency. The upgrades will include:

- Installation of energy-efficient LED lighting to brighten and modernise our classrooms
- Addition of acoustic panels to improve sound quality and reduce noise distractions
- Installation of thermal insulation in ceilings to better regulate classroom temperatures
- Upgrading electrical safety with residual current devices (RCDs)

These enhancements will bring our older classrooms up to a higher standard, creating a more comfortable and safe learning environment for everyone.

The school will be a busy place while important construction works are taking place. For the safety of everyone, we kindly ask that you remain off the school grounds during this period.

We appreciate your understanding and support as these essential improvements are carried out. Thank you for your cooperation.



Matariki

To deepen some understanding about Matariki, Thursday 19 June hosted a rotation of Matariki activities. Our learners moved around 5 areas of learning in Tuakana-Teina groups (older students and younger students).

Matariki Learning Highlights

- Waiata Fun 🎵: singing together was a beautiful way to celebrate and keep traditions alive.
- Shared Kai & Stories: enjoying pumpkin soup and bread while sharing stories saw our learners embody manaakitanga (hospitality) and bring everyone together.

"Ko te manawa ū, kia rere, kia tīna"

- Whakataukī Exploration: learning about proverbs, especially those connected to food, helped deepen our learners' understanding of Māori values and wisdom.
- Collaborative Matariki Feast / Hākari Poster: working together on a creative project strengthened our teamwork and celebrated the togetherness of Matariki.
- Learning About the 9 Stars: Understanding each star's meaning connected our learners to the environment and the deeper significance of Matariki.
- Gratitude Cards: Reflecting on gratitude and aspirations for the future aligned perfectly with the spirit of Matariki for our learners.

What an awesome way to end the week. The relaxed, engaged atmosphere - especially with everyone in their PJ's! - shows how learning can be both fun and meaningful. 









