Principal's message:

Next week the teachers in year 4,5,6,7,8 will be starting the Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT). New Zealand teachers use a variety of tests to determine what level students are at, what progress they are making, and where they may need extra help. Progressive Achievement Tests, commonly known as PATs, are one of the main sets of tests schools use.

PATs are multiple-choice tests designed to help teachers determine achievement levels of students in Mathematics, Reading Comprehension, Punctuation and Grammar and Vocabulary. The test results help teachers decide what kinds of teaching materials are needed and which methods or programs are most suitable for their students. PATs are also important because they identify the progress a student is making from year to year.

All PATs are available as online tests. Schools can also buy printed PATs from the New Zealand Council for Educational Research (NZCER), an independent research organization which first developed the tests more than 30 years ago.

PAT Pānui | PAT Reading Comprehension assesses how well Year 4 to 8 students understand the text they are reading. Each test is organized around several extended pieces of writing which include stories, poems, reports and explanations.

PAT: Reading Vocabulary assesses Year 4 to 8 students' ability to understand the words they read. Each question is based around a key word that is embedded in a short sentence. Students are asked to choose a synonym that best represents the meaning of this word from a list of five possible alternatives.

PAT Pāngarau | PAT Mathematics covers number knowledge, number strategies, algebra, geometry and measurement, and statistics. PAT Pāngarau is for Years 4 to 10, with some tests appropriate for ākonga in Year 8.

<u>PAT:</u> Punctuation and Grammar is designed to assess Years 4–8 students. Questions fall into three categories: punctuation, grammar use and grammar knowledge. Questions are aligned with the Literacy Learning Progressions keen to have your help and support!

Attendance Dues Caregiver Portal student fees

Attendance Dues and Caregiver Portal:

- Iqra School is a state integrated school. The proprietors of integrated schools charge compulsory attendance dues. Our proprietor collects attendance dues, which are a condition of enrolment at Iqra School authorized under the Education and Training Act 2020. Attendance dues are not a donation and are not eligible for a tax credit.
- At Iqra School, attendance dues are set at \$1000 per year, per student. Third and fourth students subjects to 50% discount in 2025 as long as the first child is still enrolled.
- Payments must pay through Ezypay, our third-party provider. A link to this exists in the caregivers access portal.

How to Access the Portal

To access the portal, please follow these simple steps:

- 1.Visit the Iqra School website.
- 2. Click on the Caregiver Portal button located at the top right corner of the homepage.

3. You will be directed to the Edge Caregiver site. Enter your email (the email registered in the Student Management System at Iqra School).

4.If this is your first time accessing the portal, click on "Forgot/Reset Password."

5.You will receive an email with instructions to set up your password.

6. Once you have completed these steps, you can log in using your email and the new password you set.

Setting Up Payments Through Ezypay

We have partnered with Ezypay, a third-party provider, to make the payment process easier for you. You can also access the tutorial directly here. Payment through online banking is no longer available.

We believe this portal will make it easier for you to stay connected with your child's education and the school community. If you have any questions or need assistance, please don't hesitate to contact our office.

A transaction fees will be added to each payment done as per below,

- the transaction fee for using Visa/Mastercard, which is 2.9% of the amount scheduled. Should the customer use a bank account as a payment method,
- the transaction fee would be 1.2% of the amount scheduled.


