### From the Principal

I want to take a moment to commend our students who have been sitting their corequisite exams over the past week. Their attitude, focus, and resilience have been outstanding, and it's been encouraging to see so many of them approach these assessments with confidence. With just one exam to go this Friday, I'd like to extend a sincere thank you to the teachers, peers, and support staff who have worked tirelessly behind the scenes to prepare and encourage our students – your efforts have made a real difference.

From time to time, I hear the phrase, "That shouldn't happen in a Christian school." And while the sentiment is understandable, the reality is that it sometimes does – because we are all human and all fallen. Mistakes happen, both from our students and, at times, from us as adults. The difference in a Christian school is not that we're perfect, but in how we respond when things go wrong. We have the opportunity to extend grace, speak life, and wrap one another in the fruit of the Spirit - love, patience, kindness, and self -control. John 1:14 tells us that Jesus came "full of grace and truth." Yet, in our fallen nature, we often cling to truth when we feel wronged – especially when it concerns our children – and we may demand punishment or admonishment without offering grace. But that's not the way it should be. Grace doesn't ignore wrongdoing; it chooses to correct in love, with gentleness, and in a way that respects the dignity of the person who has fallen. I encourage all our families to approach every interaction with our staff and students with both grace and truth, just as Christ did. This is how we truly live out the heart of a Christian school.

A quick reminder that our **School Board elections are coming up in September**, and we encourage parents and caregivers to consider this as a wonderful opportunity to serve and contribute to the ongoing growth and direction of our school.

#### **Auckland Writers Festival**

On May 15th, 15 year 9-11 year students from Kingsgate School attended the Auckland Writers Festival with thousands of other New Zealand kids. The day was an incredible experience, allowing young, like-minded people to come together and learn more about literature and famous writers' stories.

The first speaker we saw was Lemn Sissay, who shared amazing stories and poems from his life experience. He brought a vibe of unique, authentic British humour and shared that he writes four-line poems every morning at dawn, referring to it as an "experiment of hope". Lemn also recited an excerpt from his poetry collection, "Let the Light Pour In."

Our second speaker was Neal Shusterman, an American dystopian/sci-fi author, who shared about his start to writing and the difficulties and benefits of being a writer with neurodivergence. He had started as a boy in grade 3 who was disliked by his teacher and sent to the library; this kick-started his journey as a writer, as he only started reading books in the library. Eventually, later on, he started writing stories and even entered a competition where he didn't place. After being a camp counsellor and sharing stories with the kids there, he got inspired to write again and began writing stories. He then became an author and wrote the "Scythe" series during the age of dystopia. He then wrote a book about a happy virus called Crown Royale in his latest book, "All Better Now", which came out this year after COVID-19 circulated the world.

The final speaker was a New Zealand speculative fiction author named Lee Murray. She shared about her genre and how to write yourself into the story. Her books are based on "what if...", pondering the possibilities of our reality and building on the things that are or could go wrong. Her book "Fox Spirit on a Distant Cloud" followed a family through generations, seeing their point of view and how they had to live through the times.

Thank you to all the parents and teacher helpers for this event, we really appreciate the time that you spent to make that day possible. We are already looking forward to next year.


