A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Week 8 as we look forward to our Matariki community celebration tomorrow night. Matariki is a time to come together as a community and it celebrates the Maori new year. It's a time to reflect, celebrate and look forward to the future. As a school we love to support this community event and as per our tradition we will create the special Matariki patties for our burgers for the BBQ, there will also be some sausages. This is our way to say thank you to our community for having our back as a school and how much we appreciate that. Sadly with my broken ankle which has now been screwed back together I will have to miss my first Matariki bonfire. But I look forward to seeing the photos and hearing all about it.

Reflection is also a great thing to do as we come to the end of the term. It signals the halfway point of our learning year. It is also time to reflect on our learning as reports come out and the Board of Trustees looks at school wide data.

Building on from last week's newsletter, reporting is different this round. From the start of 2025 we had a legal obligation to be using the new refreshed curriculum for Maths 0-8 and English 0-6. The Year 7-8 English is still currently in draft. In having to use the curriculum, plan with it and create goals with kids, go through the new progressions, living it in teaching and learning each day. It made sense to report against the new curriculum which was the original expectation from the government. Some schools are saying they are not ready and are continuing to report as they did previously. We believe having to convert our new curriculum teaching and learning outcomes back to the old curriculum will be way too confusing so we are running with the new curriculum. This does come with some challenges and it will make progress hard to show in some cases. The main area of change is maths. The easiest way to explain is that the goal posts have changed. So we are having to teach concepts that have never been covered before or at that level before. The biggest shift is in the middle and senior school. So even for the best mathematician being about to say they are proficient is really hard as there are concepts we are delivering they have not had time to master. Just know we are working so hard in maths and covering a lot of concepts to fill these newly created gaps. But it will be quite a common grade to get 'progressing towards' at this point of the year as we work on these new goal posts. Trying to get to that 'proficient' by the end of the year. Please know this data shift is across the country and all schools are concerned at what the data will look like, so we are not alone.

I did target shooting and I had heaps of fun. We had to take turns to shoot the box and we had fun shooting the box. Kooper




I was at the Jackpot.


