As the nights start to get darker and the mornings crisper it is a reminder that the term is moving along fast. As per normal there are a lot of things on the radar.




Inquiry: Our castles have been created and look fabulous. More importantly we can explain the defences our castles have. Our mission now is to create weapons to attack an opposing castle.
