- about what happens in the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.
- about what happens in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Our Senior Syndicate tamariki focus on:

- what Catholic Social Teaching is.
- how to apply the principles of CST to our daily lives.
- about the See, Judge, Act process of making a decision about social justice.
- to apply the See, Judge, Act process to a situation.
- about Catholic organisations or groups who put CST into practice.
- that prayer is more than words.
- that doing good towards others is a prayer, an offering to God.
