Today as well as celebrating the Feast of St Dominic we remember the Feast of the Transfiguration of Jesus.

The disciples Peter, James, and John witnessed this amazing event and recognized, maybe for the first time, who Jesus really was.

Jesus took Peter, James, and John up onto a mountain to pray. As these disciples watched in awe, Jesus transfigured (changed appearance). His face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Even more incredible, Jesus was joined by the long-dead Moses and Elijah.

This appearance was an affirmation of Jesus as the fulfilment of the law and the prophets. The whole phenomenon of the transfiguration was an affirmation of Jesus as the Messiah. 
Happy Cook Island Language Week. We started off the week raising the Cook Island flag and listening to the National anthem. We will be learning about the Cook Islands throughout the week.
