#### Today is the feast day of St John Paul II.

Saint John Paul II was the first and only pope to visit New Zealand. He came to Christchurch on the 24th Nov 1986. Here he is with our Dunedin Bishop at the time, Bishop Len Boyle.

**Some other fun facts about St John Paul II** - who was one of the most loved popes in history. He inspired millions with his kindness, courage, and deep faith in God.

- ♥ Born Karol Wojtyła in Poland in 1920 he grew up during difficult times of war but never lost his faith.
- He loved sports! As a young man, he played soccer as a goalie, hiked, skied, and loved the outdoors.
- Before becoming a priest, he was also a theatre actor and poet.
- $\triangle$  He became pope in 1978, the first non-Italian pope in over 400 years.
- He travelled to over 120 countries, more than any other pope before him, spreading a message of peace, hope, and God's love.
- ☐ He often said, "Do not be afraid!" encouraging people to trust God in all things.
- He started World Youth Day, bringing together young Catholics from around the world to celebrate faith and friendship.
- $\heartsuit$  He had a special devotion to Mary and his motto was "Totus Tuus" *Totally Yours*, meaning he gave his whole life to Jesus through Mary.
- \$\text{\text{\$\geq}}\$ He helped bring peace and freedom to countries suffering under communism, including his own homeland of Poland.
- st John Paul II died in 2005 and was canonised (made a saint) in 2014.

### LEARNING IN THE MIDDLE SYNDICATE ROOM 10


