This Saturday and Sunday we celebrate two important feast days in the Catholic Church. Saturday, 1st November is All Saints Day and Sunday, 2nd November is All Souls Day.

What is a saint?

A saint is a person, described as a "holy person," who loved God and others and lived a life of faith.

What is All Saints Day?

It is a day to celebrate "heavenly friends" and learn about people who were faithful, good, kind, and brave. It's a time to remember and give thanks for all the saints, both the famous ones and those we may not know.



What is All Souls Day?



On All Souls' Day the Catholic Church remembers all those who have died not just the great and the good, but the ordinary and especially those loved ones. It reminds us of our connectedness to the faithful and all those special to us, who have died. All of them are honoured by the church.

During the whole month of November, the Church traditionally remembers those whom God has called through death to eternal life. As a whanau you may wish to pray this traditional prayer to remember all your loved ones who have gone to be with God.
