Last Wednesday we visited the Pahiatua Museum. Gilda and Andrew McKnight shared their wonderful knowledge of our local area's history. Huia and the Year 4's investigated the Polish children's story as well as the local soldiers who fought in WW2. The Juniors looked at the objects in the museum's rooms and completed a scavenger hunt.





On Thursday Kinnie Vermeulen spent part of the morning in Huia class. Kinnie is a leading toast master in NZ and came to share her experience and expertise with our children as they work on their speeches. She shared her visit to Alfredton on her radio program today in her discussions with MP Mike Butterick, her guest on the show.



Our school speech competition will take place in Huia class on Wednesday 27th August after morning tea (11am). Children from Year 2 upwards will present their speeches. One child will be selected from Year 6, 7 or 8 to represent our school at the Pahiatua Lions Speechmaker Contest on September 3rd. You are welcome to come and listen to the speeches. 





Yay! We launched Stem!

(Science, technology, engineering and mathematics).

On Thursday 7th August the year 7 and 8s went to tech and the year 5s and 6s did our first Stem Challenge Day. STEM is science, technology, engineering and maths all put together into pretty big challenges for us to do. We did 3 main challenges: pancakes, marshmallow tower and foil boats.

The first thing we did was the marshmallow tower challenge. We all split into teams; (one of 3 students and one of 4). Olive, Rupert and Levi made one group and the other was Nellie, May, Emily and Sophie. We were given 20 bits of spaghetti, one meter of tape and string and a marshmallow. The point of the challenge was to build the tallest tower with what we were given and to balance a marshmallow on top without securing it with tape, string or sticking on spaghetti. It was hard, but both groups managed to make it work. In the end the winners were Nellie, May, Emily and Sophie because their tower measured the highest. It stood 24.5 cm tall. We felt excited because we made it work!

Second was the foil boat challenge. In this one we were given 30cm of foil to make a boat and see how many marbles it could carry without sinking. The winner was Sophie. She got all 26 marbles in her boat and it still did not sink!




