

# Faith Focus - Term 3, Week 5 Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - Fri 15th Aug

The Blessed Virgin Mary is the patron saint of New Zealand and today is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is a day which commemorates when Mary was taken ("assumed") into heaven, body and soul, after she died. This story is not in the Bible; however, a tradition handed down from the earliest days of the Church says that Mary died in Jerusalem and was buried in a tomb. But when the apostles opened the tomb again, her body was gone.

Why would God take Mary's body and soul into heaven? In part because Mary is special to God: she said "yes" to becoming the mother of Jesus. But God also wanted to show us that one day, all of us will share in the bodily resurrection of Jesus. Mary is the first person in the Church to experience the resurrection in its fullness.
